Sign Up for Education Cost Sharing Equality

Norwalk's education funding has been shortchanged for years by the state's existing Education Cost Sharing (ECS) formula. Currently, Norwalk pays 93% of its education costs via taxes and the state supplies 7%. Other similar school districts get closer to 29% from the state. NEF is working with local organizations and representatives to try to level the playing field. They have started a petition to help Norwalk's legislators advocate for a change in the funding formula, giving Norwalk Public Schools a fair allocation.

NEF's new Tech Smart Teacher program, Tech Integrators, is up and off to a great start. Fourteen schools have staff members in place identifying and scheduling tech classes appropriate for the needs of their staff. Classes around MOBIs, Clickers, Smartboards have already been offered, and Tech Integrators will be offering support for tech initiatives at their schools as well. This program is extremely important since it allows Norwalk teachers to have ready access to the skills they need in order for students to be part of 21st Century learning.
