Schools and NEF will be there to support them. The largest initiative in the Norwalk Schools is the launch of the multi-year Common Core Standards Plan in preparation for the full adoption of the Common Core State Standards in the 2014/2015 school year. The Common Core State Standards Initiative will establish one set of academic standards in the essential areas of Math, English/Language Arts and eventually Science for all students at each grade level in all the 46 states that have voluntarily adopted them thus far. Assessments will transition from CMTs to national computer adaptive exams for kindergarten through 11th grade. Previously, each state set their own standards and conducted their own tests.

NEF will play a role in that transition, educating parents and the community about the Common Core Standards and what this means for our children. Already a series of community conversations is being planned. We hope to offer a forum on the Common Core in every elementary school this year.

NEF is also designing programs and tools to support the Common Core initiatives. A Math Coach Program Pilot is starting in four schools. With additional funding, Math Coaches will be expanded to all 12 elementary schools. The Math Coach concept leverages our best practice model - Tech Smart Teacher Training - our flagship program that continues on this year.

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
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
